GOAL 1

Pursue outreach, faculty development and support that will lead to an increase in the quality and quantity of service-learning courses at Fresno State, reversing the multi-year slide in service-learning course offerings and enrollment.

10 Faculty engaged in training and professional development.



113,551 service-learning hours provided to the community.

173 Service-learning classes offered.



4 new S-designated courses; 7 courses recertified for S-designation.

3,499 Students enrolled in service-learning courses.

GOAL 2

Continue to foster a diverse and meaningful continuum of community service opportunities.



2 community service opportunity fairs, featuring **98** community benefit organizations, garnering **2,901** contacts between students and agencies.



21 Scholars in Service students served **2,911** hours with **13** organizations.



2 virtual student showcases where **259** students presented **105** posters highlighting their service experiences.



11 Richter Center Student Leaders made **856** points of contact with their peers and provided **939** hours of service.



580 children mentored, tutored, and supported by **125** Jumpstart and Read Fresno members in collaboration with **21** community partners.



143 students earned **\$737,276** to support their education through scholarships and work-study by providing **43,140** hours of service to the community.

GOAL 3

Foster a successful launch and first year of the new Central Valley College Corps Program.



Recruited and placed **91** students with **14** community benefit organizations, providing a total of **33,735** hours of service.



CVCC Fellows: Mentored nearly **1,140** students attending elementary schools in Fresno Unified School District, planted over **27,000** trees, and distributed over **2,066,122** pounds of food to those experiencing food insecurity.



Supported a total of **16** undocumented AB 540 students that were part of the CVCC program.
