Data in Undergraduate Program Review Packet

The purpose of these sheets is to provide you with an overview of the data in your program review packet. The sections below are in the same order as the data in your packet. Several sections also include references to data tables that are available on the Office of Institutional Effectiveness (OIE) Tableau server for comparisons.

The first step in creating your data packet is to go to the Front Sheet of the <u>Program Review dashboard</u>. Once there, use the drop-down filters at the top to select your College, Department, and relevant Academic Plans. If you don't know which academic plans define your program, please reach out to OIE. Next, select Download> PDF> Include Specific sheets from this workbook> Select All> Create PDF.

Applications

- Count of students who have applied, been admitted, and enrolled, both in your program and in your college.
 - Each row here represents a semester of fall applicants.

Enrollment & FTES

In the Program review packet, headcount data includes undergraduate and post baccalaureate (second bachelor's degrees) as one category. All students are degree-seeking students.

- Shows enrollment for your program, college, and the whole university.
 - Each column here shows headcount for a given fall semester.
- > Breaks out program enrollment by gender and ethnicity, as well as double majors and minors.
- > Shows FTES of courses taught for you program, college, and the whole university.

Academic Preparation

- ➤ Shows SAT scores and HS GPA for your program, college, and the whole university.
 - Each column here shows the data for only new students who were first-time freshmen (i.e., this was their first university enrollment).
 - For more information, see the <u>Enrollment Trends</u> dashboard. SAT scores and HS GPAs are in Breakdown 4, and first-time freshmen can be selected using the "New Students Only" filter.

Retention

- ➤ The tables on the left show one-year university retention for first-time freshmen and the tables on the right show one-year retention for first-time transfer students (i.e., these students had a previous university enrollment, but this is the first time they enrolled at Fresno State). A student is counted as being retained if they enrolled for a second year, regardless of whether they changed their major.
 - Each column here represents an incoming cohort of students. For instance, the Fall 2018 column represents students who entered the university in Fall 2018 and whether they returned in Fall 2019.

First-Time Junior Graduation Rate

- ➤ The top tables show the number of students who graduated within two and three years from the point at which they earned Junior status (i.e., 90 units). The benefits of this graduation rate are that it combines first-time freshmen, first-time transfers, and students who change into the major into one cohort, while excluding students who change our of your program before their junior year.
 - Each column here represents a cohort of students who attained junior status, either through earning or transferring in with 90 units. For instance, the Fall 2016 column represents students who earned junior status in Fall 2016, and whether they had graduated by Fall 2018, Fall 2019, or beyond.

- > The bottom tables show the degrees received by these cohorts of new Junior status students and whether their degrees were in your program.

Degrees by Ethnicity

- ➤ These tables show the degrees earned in your program, college, and the university, broken out by ethnicity. Each column is an academic year's worth of degrees awarded (Summer, Fall, and Spring semesters).

Course & Equity

- > The first table shows the courses your department offered and the enrollment in those courses, broken down by course level and GE fulfillment.
- ➤ The second table breaks down course performance by Pell receipt. Eliminating the Pell Non-Pell performance gap is one of the goals of the Graduation Initiative 2025.
- ➤ The third table breaks down course performance by underrepresented minority status. Students from underrepresented minorities are Hispanic, Pacific Islander, African American, or Native American. Eliminating the URM Non-URM performance gap is one of the goals of the Graduation Initiative 2025.
